Family conversation guide after your visit

- What is something that stood out about what you learned today?

- Did you notice anything in the home that we have in our house?
- Did you notice anything about the home that was different from our home?
- Did you hear our quide say anything that you have questions about?
- What do you think it would have been like to be a kid growing up at Lakeport?
- Can you believe the Mississippi River used to be right out the dining room window?
- What would be a vegetable you would want to grow in your garden here?
- Did you learn anything about growing cotton that surprised you?
- What things do they make with cotton?
- If you close your eyes and think about Lakeport Plantation, what images do you see? (Consider offering a color page or blank paper to let your children draw images they imagine from conversations today)



Tough Topics -

If you are willing to process the topic of slavery and your kids are old enough, you may talk more about the topic.

- Did you hear or read about the topic of slavery or enslaved people today?
